<p><b>qPCR DNA Contamination (E. coli Genomic)</b>            A minimum of 1 unit of Antarctic Thermolabile UDG is screened for the presence of E. coli genomic DNA using SYBR® Green qPCR with primers specific for the E. coli 16S rRNA locus. Results are quantified using a standard curve generated from purified E. coli genomic DNA. The measured level of E. coli genomic DNA contamination is ≤ 1 E. coli genome.</p>	Pass
